

## The passing of a giant

L.W. "Sonny" Dubose passed away on Dec. 11, 2007, at the age of 91. With him goes the most important chapter in the history of the South Texas Golf Course Superintendents Association— Dubose was the last living member of the STGCSA's founding fathers.

The STGCSA sprang into existence on Dec. 16, 1958, the brainchild of Dubose, J.L. Jennings, Kenneth Flanders, Sid Cox, Donald White, Ervin Henderson and Lewis Nash, all of whom had a vision of what the golf course superintendent profession in southeast Texas needed and the realization that it would take teamwork to fulfill those needs.


They joined together at River Oaks Country Club to formalize the fledgling organization and began working to improve the profession and the business upon which it is focused. Today, a half-century later, the STGCSA has become a highly organized, professional operation that includes over

300 members, each of whom owes a debt of gratitude to Dubose and his comrades.

Born in Louisiana on June 29, 1916, Dubose entered the golf course maintenance business in 1940 as the superintendent at Westwood Country Club. He moved to Houston Country Club in 1942, and with the exception of a short stint at Braeburn Country Club, remained there for the next 40 years.

He worked for Gail's Flags for several years following his retirement from Houston Country Club prior to starting his own company, Sonny Dubose Products, retiring from that business (his son, Larry, assumed the leadership role) in the mid-1990s.

For Dubose, retirement did not mean inactivity . . . he remained involved in the profession for the rest of his life (he attended every Texas Turfgrass Association conference until about four

years ago, when his health forced him to forego attendance).

Dubose served eagerly and earned a number of honors during his career. He was the president of the Texas Turfgrass Association in 1960 and earned the TTA's A.W. Crain Diamond Award in 1978.

He served three terms as president of the STGCSA in 1960, 1964-65 and 1971 and spent three years on the Golf Course Superintendents Association of America Board of Directors. Dubose received the GCSAA's Distinguished Service Award in 2001.

Tom Leonard, STGCSA president in 1964, spent many personal and professional hours with Dubose, says of him, "His personality and his dedication to the business were what set Sonny apart. He was more like a big brother to me . . . he opened a lot of doors for me and our fellow superintendents."

Dubose is survived by Evelyn, his wife of 66 years, and his son and daughter, Leon and Patsy, and their spouses, four grandchildren and two great-grandchildren. Larry Dubose passed away in 1996.

Sonny Dubose is also survived by a wealth of friends and colleagues, all of who recognize his significance in their lives.

"If it wasn't for Sonny, we may not have had such an organization (as the STGCSA," says Leonard.

Accordingly, the South Texas Golf Course Superintendents Association is honoring is contributions with the creation of the "Sonny Dubose Superintendent of the Year" award (see Roger Goettsch's "President's Message" on page 2 for more details).

To his family, the membership of the STGCSA wishes to express its sympathies for his loss and its gratitude for the opportunity of having shared in Sonny's life.

## **Tournament Committee announces changes for 2008**

The purposes of the year-long "Points System" used in conjunction with STGCSA Monthly Meetings and golf outings are to reward members for their participation in and contributions to STGCSA activities and outstanding play on the course.

The Chapter's Tournament Committee reviews the system periodically in an effort to provide an equitable distribution of points, and that's what has happened recently—the system has been adjusted for 2008.

Points for attending meetings and playing golf will be awarded as in the past. However, members who provide RSVPs for meetings (and attend the respective meeting) by noon on the Friday before each meeting will receive 25 bonus points. In addition, all members participating in the associated golf outing will receive a minimum of five (5) points.

As in the past, no points will be awarded at our Scholarship Tournament, Superintendent/Pro & Member/Member Tournament or our Astros game outing.

In addition to the above change in the "Points System," a new competition is being introduced to STGCSA golf events for this year. In short, its purpose is to qualify four superintendents as part of the STGCSA's representation at the 2008 Texas Trophy— all four will receive paid entry into the 2008 tournament (providing they have not otherwise qualified for paid entry into the Texas Trophy event).

The qualifiers will be determined through a "Long Drive" competition that will be held during the golf events at the March, May, June and July meetings. Two qualifying holes will be designated at each of those events, during which all superintendents will record their driving distance (within a designated grid) on both holes—golfers will be ranked on the basis of "Total Driving," computed by totaling their driving distance and driving accuracy (according to a formula used on the PGA Tour).

Hopefully, these changes will provide new incentive for our membership to attend more meetings and play in more of our golf outings. If you have any questions about the changes, please direct them to a member of our Tournament Committee (Chairman Mark Haven, Bret Barclay, Mark Baughman, Russell Tippie, Wade Warms, Sean Wilson).
