tradition. That would be of, course, the selection of the Chapter's Sonny DuBose Superintendent of the Year.

This year will mark the fourth time the STGCSA has so honored one of its members with an award created and named in honor and memory of one of the STGCSA's founding members and a man who had a lasting and positive effect on the profession and his fellow superintendents.

Terry Gill, Johnny Walker and Randy Samoff were the recipients of the award in 2008 through 2010. Each of those men fulfilled the purposes for which the award was created . . . to honor both the award's namesake and superintendent who have made significant and continual contributions to the industry and the Chapter. There is no doubt the Chapter's 2011 selection will continue building on that foundation.

"This award is special because of the man it is named for, the men who have won it, and the fact that, in the end, the recipient is chosen by his peers," said Cole. "It's also important to note that initial nominations are made by facility owners, general managers, Greens Committee chairmen and golf professionals, as well as by a nominees fellow members."

The nomination process has begun. Nominations may be made by the general managers and head golf professionals at golf facilities throughout the Chapter's geographical territory, and, where appropriate, to the chairmen of Greens Committees. The forms needed to submit nominations were mailed to people in those positions at facilities throughout the STGC-SA's geographical area on June 24.

Any STGCSA member in good standing may submit a nomination. Please keep in mind, however, that all eligible nominees must be STGCSA members in good standing, have been members of the STGCSA for a minimum of five consecutive years and must not have previously won the award.

The STGCSA's Public Relations Committee, led by Chairman Brandon Cole, will then review the nominations. After selecting a set of finalists, Cole and the past winners will then visit each finalist's facility for a tour and interview. The information gained from those visits and the respective nomination letters will then be presented to the STGCSA's members during the Chapter's 2011 Annual Meeting.

The members will then vote for their choice as the recipient of the 2011 award, and the honor will be announced during a presentation ceremony at the 2011 STGCSA Awards Banquet and Awards Ceremony in December.

A nomination form will be posted on the home page of the Chapter web site (www.stgcsa.org). The deadline for submitting a nomination will be Sept. 30, 2011.

"Five well-deserving superintendents were nominated last year and the number seems to be growing every year," Cole said. "A few nominations came in after the deadline last year, so it's important that you make sure your management submits nominations on time."

Please take time to submit your choice for the award and help recognize one of your fellow members.

Nicklaus II opened in 2003. The home course for Texas A&M University's men's and women's golf teams, The Traditions recently hosted the 2011 NCAA Women's Golf National Championship tournament.

The par-72 course stretches to 7,146-yard championship yards laid out over rolling terrain, through hardwood forests and along and over many natural creeks and wetlands. Strategically-placed bunkers add to the layout's defenses and let you know where the Nicklaus' intended your ball to land.

Jesse Shulse, younger brother of past STGCSA President Justin Shulse, is the golf course superintendent at The Traditions. Born in Germany, Shulse is a 2004 graduate of Texas A&M. His career began at River Ridge Golf Club, where he spent his collegiate summers working for his brother. He also interned at Lochinvar and Champions Golf Clubs and with the USGA during his college years.

He was an assistant superintendent at Champions under Charles Joachim, GCGS, for several years prior to moving to Aggieland (along with his wife, Melody, daughter Ryleigh (4) and son Wesley (2)) to take the top spot at The Traditions.

Out of Bounds: Household hazardous waste disposal options

Batteries, oil filters, computer monitors, and fluorescent light bulbs are just a few examples of products that are common household hazardous waste.

With over 4 million people in Harris County alone, the disposal of household hazardous wastes can pose a significant environmental risk.

The average American disposes of 15 pounds of household hazardous waste per year. When these items make their way to the landfill, they can contaminate ground water and surface water.

So what do I do with all the junk that I know should not go into general trash collection? There are a number of options available in the Houston area. Go to the following link for locations and contact information: http://www.cleanwaterways.org/HHW/collection.html.

Another interesting option I discovered is the "Resource Exchange Network for Eliminating Waste" (RENEW).

RENEW is a free materials-exchange network created in 1987 by the Texas Legislature. Basically, the website is a listing of wanted and available materials. Briefly looking at the site I found that I could become the proud owner of pure ethanol, potash, nonvolatile condensation products, cotton gloves, and bricks (if I so desired). If you'd like to take a look at it, the address is http://www.zerowastenetwork.org/renewdev/.

A final website you may want to visit is http://www.freecy-cle.org/. This non-profit volunteer-based network is for the exchange of all types of items.

The website is searchable by location. While this site does not specialize in household hazardous waste, it does have many different items from TV's to furniture, to books.



The Texas AgriLife Extension Service will conduct a free Turfgrass Management Practices Field Day focusing on "Rollers and Mowing Heights" on Aug. 23 at Wildcat Golf

The agenda for the meeting, which will run from 12:30 to 3:30 p.m., includes presentations and open discussion about mowing height and turfgrass health, rolling for green speed and true ball rolls (presented by Dr. David Chalmers, a professor in Texas A&M University's Department of Soil and Crop Sciences), measuring for ball speed and demonstration of measuring ball speed, followed by a demonstration of rollers (by Brookside Equipment Sales and Luber Brothers).
