

Who will you nominate?

The time has come to begin submitting nominations for the South Texas Golf Course Superintendents Association's 2010 Sonny DuBose Superintendent of the Year Award.

The award is in the third year of its history. That's not quite long enough to call it a tradition, but it has those kinds of trappings.

The award is named, for instance, in memory of one of the STGC-SA's founding members and a man who had a lasting and positive effect on the profession and his fellow superintendents.

Terry Gill and Johnny Walker, the recipients in 2008 and 2009, fulfilled the purposes for which the award was created. . . to honor both the award's namesake and superintendent who have made significant and continual contributions to the industry and the Chapter. There is no doubt the 2010 honoree will continue to build on that foundation.

The nomination process will begin with the mailing of nomination forms in late June or early July. While the process remains basically the same as last year, there is one significant change that requires the assistance of the STGCSA's members.

In the past, the forms have been mailed to general addressees . . . Attn: General Manger, etc., at the area's golf facilities. This year, you

are being asked to provide the name of your facility's lead management person to insure the form reaches the proper destination.

"Our goal is to get the forms into the hands of a manager responsible for supervision of a golf course superintendent," explains Russell Birkhimer, one of the co-chairmen of the STPGA's Public Relations Committee, which will coordinate the nominations process. "We want to make sure as many deserving superintendents as possible are nominated, and we feel like we'll get better response if we mail the forms to specific people rather than a general addressee."

Nominations may be made by the general managers and head golf professionals at golf facilities throughout the Chapter's geographical territory, and, where appropriate, to the chairmen of Greens Committees.

In addition, any STGCSA member in good standing may submit a nomination. Please keep in mind, however, that all eligible nominees must be STGCSA members in good standing, have been members of the STGCSA for a minimum of five consecutive years and must not have previously won the award.

The STGCSA's Public Relations Committee, led by Co-Chairmen Birkhimer and Brandon Cole, will then review the nominations, select a set of finalists and then visit each finalist's facility for a tour and an interview. The information gained from those visits and the respective nominations letters will then be presented to the STGCSA's members during the Chapter's Annual Meeting, set for Nov. 8 at BraeBurn Country Club.

The members will then vote for their choice as the recipient of the 2010 award, and the honor will be announced during a presentation ceremony at the 2010 STGCSA Awards Banquet and Awards Ceremony in December.

Anomination form will be posted on the Chapter web site as soon as it becomes available. The deadline for submitting a nomination will be Sept. 30, 2010.

Please take time to submit your choice for the award and help recognize one of your fellow members.

"There are many superintendents in our Chapter who are deserving of our recognition for the work they do to help our organization and our profession," says Birkhimer. "The Sonny DuBose Superintendent of the Year Award is our only means of formalizing that recognition, and it deserves our careful thought and consideration."

"Our careers and lives have been tremendously affected by professionals like Sonny DuBose, Terry Gill and Johnny Walker," Brikhimer adds. "I hope all our members will take part in the process of honoring another of our members who falls into that same category."
