

Carl Tolbert an update and a reminder

When word that Carl Tolbert had been involved in an automobile accident several weeks ago trickled out, many members of the South Texas Golf Course Superintendents Association were stopped in their tracks. It was tough news to absorb if you've been around long enough to recall the role Tolbert has played in the development of the Chapter.

Tolbert, 66 and a native of Temple, Texas, lost control of his truck near his home in High Meadow Ranch. Coming home from a Mar. 25 trip to a store, Tolbert said he came to a double-S curve where several accidents have taken place, hit a puddle of rainwater, and lost control. His truck hit the ditch alongside the road.

"I wasn't speeding or anything," said Tolbert. "I just hit a spot. The truck rolled. It's totaled . . . they had to take me out through the back of the cab."

Initial reports that Tolbert had suffered a broken back and neck turned out to be true, but thankfully, his spinal cord was not significantly damaged.

Tolbert endured surgery on Mar. 26 and was home within a few days.

"I was wearing my seatbelt, but my head hit the roof of the truck and I had third-degree burns from that," he said. "I still have some pain and numbness, but it could have been a lot worse."

Tolbert is already going through therapy that includes, amongst other things, a couple of daily walks around his neighborhood. He said his doctors estimate a recovery period of eight to 10 months.

He can't wait, of course, and was joking with STGCSA Board member Mark Baughman by Mar. 30 that "he will be asking for strokes when he makes his comeback."

Tolbert has been a fixture within the Chapter since he joined the organization in 1988. A 1968 graduate of North Texas State University, he worked in the insurance industry from then until 1985, when he first joined the golf course maintenance business selling sand and gravel to golf courses in 1985. In 1988, he went to work for South Coast Energy, and then, in 1991, he joined the staff at A.N. Rusche Distributing, a (Chevron) fuel distributor, where he worked until that company was sold in 2000.

That's when he became part of the sales team at The Hurt Company, where he still works.

In 1997, then STGCSA Board member and Tournament Committee Chairman Stephen Wood pulled Carl aside. Tolbert had been searching for a cause that would help the STGCSA grow . . . Wood asked him if he wanted to chair the Tournament Committee; Carl said yes, Wood nominated him, and for the next eight years (through 2005), Tolbert was "the man" when it came to STGCSA golf events.

His special focus was the Chapter's annual Scholarship Tournament.

"When I took over in 1997, there was \$4,000 in our Scholarship Fund," said Tolbert. "I had given \$1,000 to the fund every year while I was at A.N. Rusche. We had taken a survey of our members and knew that we had a large group of members' children ready for college over the next several

President's Message

Good news abounds! For starters, it rained. A lot. Maybe even too much in some areas, but in the end, the storms that blew through southeast Texas in mid-April brought gallons of muchneeded moisture to the area. Based on what's left to figure in, I'm going to guess we actually raised a few thousand dollars more than that.

That's very significant, especially when you consider its proximity to the funds raised last year, when the economy was on the verge of taking its nosedive instead of flat on the ground as a result of it. And that's despite the fact that we didn't quite sell out the field this time around.

From all reports, the golfers who played in the tournament had a great time, but that's no surprise, considering the always-popular nature of the course at High Meadow Ranch Golf Club. As has been their habit, Cody Spivey and his staff did an outstanding job of hosting the tournament— the course could not have been better and the same can be said of the service and the hospitality.

We introduced a new twist to our fundraising activities during the tournament.

As you know, John Maloney's daughter, Allison, died in a traffic accident last month. The Chapter had previously given John \$1,000 to help defray the associated expenses. We asked that our members provide additional donations during the Scholarship Tournament and many responded very generously.

Brandon Marek, who won the "50-50" contest at the tournament, donated his half of the winnings to the "Maloney fund" (the other half went into our scholarship fund). Jeff Smith donated prodcut to our auction, specifying the funds raised from it's sale be used to help John and his family. In addition, we put a



"basket" out during registration and many of our members used it for their own personal donations.

All told, the STGCSA donated over \$3,000 to try to help the Maloney's through a very difficult stretch. Needless to say, nothing we could do can replace their loss, but John is a member of our family (just as all our members are)— all we can do is hope our contributions have helped a bit.



"When I left the committee in 2005, I think we had over \$120,000 in the Scholarship Fund, and we've been able to provide help for a large number of young students," said Tolbert. "That's my legacy to the STGCSA. I enjoyed doing it . . . it was fun and well worth the effort."
