





Difficult Weeds of the Future

Back in my college days, we learned that a weed is just a plant out of place. That definition is still correct today but removing these plants has become more difficult. Back in the day, all we had to know is whether the weed was a grass weed, broadleaf weed or a sedge and then we could pick our herbicide accordingly.

Within this decade, we all have experienced weeds that have lost herbicide sensitivity, aka resistant goosegrass and Poa annua. The new exciting class of chemistry called sulfonylureas controlled so many weeds without discoloring the desirable turf the professional turfgrass manager became hooked on them for everything from Poa annua, goosegrass to kyllinga and sedges.

Personal experience has taught me when we change herbicide practices we sometimes end up with unexpected results. Before Monument® herbicide received registration, within my territory, Syngenta sold more Pennant Magnum® pre-emergent herbicide in the spring than it did Barricade®. Pennant Magnum® was popular for reduc-

ing yellow nutsedge and kyllinga from seed as well as your other typical spring weeds. The popularity of Monument® for controlling all sedges and kyllinga caused the use of Pennant Magnum® to diminish. More doveweed started appearing soon afterwards. Doveweed would be considered a weed of the future since it was almost impossible to control post-emergence. Fortunately, the industry has started incorporating products like Pennant Magnum® and Tower® into spring herbicide programs because both herbicides have these weeds listed on their labels.

Henry's Crabgrass, (Digitaria ciliaris) is the next major hurdle we will be facing. We have been fighting this weed for several years without much success. We in the Houston area were calling it by the wrong name, India crabgrass but now we know better. It didn't matter what name we called it, we could not control it from showing up on our professionally managed turf. Henry's crabgrass didn't seem to mind what pre-emergence herbicide we applied, it just invited itself over to stay and liked every height of cut. The typical crabgrass post-emergence herbicide didn't control it either. By the end of summer, this crabgrass variety with short internodes and shorter leaves, forms into a massive mat that roots itself at each internode that touches the soil. While doing some research on this weed, it seems to thrive in Hawaii, but I have noticed it getting much worse throughout my territory of southern TX and all of Louisiana.

My final weed of the future that causes me the most anxiety is KR Bluestem. The KR stands for King Ranch since this was the first place this seed from Asia was planted. This weed has always been spotty in turfgrass areas in San Antonio, Austin, College Station and the south Texas region. Since Hurricane Harvey's flood waters came into Houston and Victoria Texas, this weed has exploded. I can identify this

weed on almost every commercial property and school district grounds. From a distance, this grassy weed can look like Dallisgrass, but it is tougher to control. I can remember reading an herbicide research study a long time ago when the SU herbicides were coming into the market like Revolver® and Monument®. I do remember the only herbicide to give some control was the non-selective herbicide glyphosate, all other herbicides in trial didn't give any relief. Most control options on the internet include words like plowing and burning. Properties with good preemergence programs don't seem to have this weed for now. If this perennial grass weed ever gets established your selective post emergence herbicides options are currently non-existent.

> I have been in the turfgrass industry for 32 years. It seems that the first 2 decades were simpler in regards to weed control. Grass weeds received a mighty dose of MSMA + Sencor and if it was a

broadleaf it was sprayed with a 3-way herbicide which always included 2,4-D. I will close with a quote from Dr. Scott McElroy, Weed Scientist from Auburn University "long gone are the days of spraying a single herbicide, the future must contain a tank-mix of multiple active ingredients from different classes of chemistry"

Bioengineered Living Shorelines the Newest Erosion Control Solution

When development companies design golf courses with lakes and stormwater ponds, they envision them as beautiful aquatic resources to attract visitors, connect with nature and enhance the surrounding property. Without proper management, however, these waterbodies can quickly become eyesores that produce harmful algae and bad odors, lead to damaged and eroded shorelines, and result in displeased members.

Most aquatic management professionals will tell you that when a golf course superintendent calls about an issue at their waterbody, it's often past the point of a quick fix. This is regularly the case when we arrive onsite to look at an erosion issue on a lake or pond embankment. Rather than finding a few problematic patches of rock or soil, we discover steep, unstable banks, deep washouts and extensive bottom muck caused by years of sedimentation.

Erosion is a natural process caused by wind, rainfall, poor design, cultural impacts like mowing and recreation, or simply an aging aquatic ecosystem. These erosion issues are all exacerbated by human disturbance. Unfortunately, erosion can also negatively affect your lake, stormwater pond, canal or coastline by causing loss of habitat and property value, nutrient loading, reduced storage volume and waterbody depth, and excess runoff. When topsoil is displaced, stormwater pipes and structures can be exposed and damaged. Overtime, erosion can lead to the formation of trenches and gullies that pose a serious danger to the public.

There are many ways to correct erosion with rip-rap, bulkheads, and other hard armoring systems; in certain situations, they may be the preferred option. In my experience, however, reestablishing the embankment utilizing vegetation, whether turf grass for recreation or native vegetation for habitat, has always been an excellent way to halt erosion and enhance golf course waterbodies. There are several best management practices that can help stop erosion and establish vegetation, but a lot of them have a shorter life-span or planting restrictions. Fortunately, there is a new solution available for both the immediate and long-term stabilization of shorelines and hillsides.

Bioengineered living shorelines are the latest technology in erosion control. These patented woven systems offer an innovative, environmentally-friendly solution to immediately stop shoreline and embankment erosion and create a natural foundation for vegetation. The most effective systems available are designed using a combination of ecofriendly, bio-degradable burlap sock-like fabric and heavy-duty knitted mesh. The socks can be filled with local pond muck and sediment, which is why many superintendents choose to pair this solution with proactive hydro-raking projects. After the woven mesh systems are filled, they are then secured to the embankment and can be immediately sodded, planted with native beneficial buffer plants, or seeded through the mesh and fabric layers.

As an Environmental Scientist, I've utilized several different shoreline restoration techniques over the years, but this

innovative system is certainly creating some excitement! It provides immediate stabilization while effectively filtering and buffering run-off water, removing harmful contaminants and benefiting waterways and water quality, all the while providing a seamless planting platform and long-lasting erosion control. Restored banks and hillsides can be walked on within just a few days, making bioengineered shorelines a fast, aesthetically-pleasing and longlasting solution for most properties.

Depending on your waterbody and specific erosion issues, goals and budget, your lake management professional may recommend other natural restoration tools. Lakes and ponds that experience heavy water movement may be suitable candidates for erosion control using logs comprised of coconut fibers. Installed in areas with direct water flow, these biodegradable logs can help redirect water movement while reducing erosion along delicate banks. Coconut "coir" logs are biodegradable, compact and excellent solutions for properties in need of a truly custom erosion control approach.

Whether you decide to move forward with a complete shoreline restoration or are several years away, it's imperative to properly budget and integrate proactive management strategies that protect your banks and hillsides, while preserving the water quality of your aquatic resource. Cultivating a beneficial vegetative buffer with flowering native vegetation will help stabilize soil during rainstorms. Deep-rooted flowering plants can also help pull excess nutrients from storm-

water runoff, preventing the growth of nuisance weeds and algae in the water resource. Undesirable nutrients can be further combated with the professional application of naturally-occurring nutrient remediation products, which permanently "lock up" and prevent nutrients from fueling aquatic weeds or algae.

Just like turfgrass management, lake and stormwater pond management is an ongoing commitment that requires different approaches throughout the year. While no two waterbodies are the same, each and every aquatic ecosystem is susceptible to shoreline erosion and can benefit from custom management plans that integrate buffer management and nutrient remediation, as well as other sustainable tools like hydro-raking, aeration, biological augmentation, and regular water quality testing. Whether your waterbody is in its prime or has seen better days, contact your lake management professional to restore and prolong your water resources—starting with the shoreline.
