PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

David Gray - President STGCSA



Hello Everybody! Thank goodness were cooling off some and the days are getting shorter! I think everybody knows my pattern by now and has probably just accepted the rambling and run on statements, however as always, I want to give a big "Thank you!" to Kevin Hill with Walden on Lake Conroe and Jeff Smelser at Galveston Country Club for hosting STGCSA meetings this year. We greatly appreciate your involvement with the association and love playing great courses. Thanks Again!

So back in late August when I wrote my message, I left off talking about healing some thin areas affected by disease and shade, more hollow tines on the greens this next warm season and preparing for fall pre-emerge apps. Well moving on and now in late October, these last two months have been rather interesting, not long after the last message feral hogs started getting on the course again and luckily, they stayed away from the greens. This happened last December also I remember I wrote about it in one of the previous president messages. Well they started again and progressively got worse and worse. I started coming to the course at night over the weekends and some week days trying to "scare them off" so I told the membership. By the way my wife was not always happy about this, but she still came with me a lot! I even contacted a TDA representative to help with the problem also. He is on stand-by to help if the problem starts up again. They were rooting on and off for about the last month, and one day just stopped. Let's just say there will be a grub treatment app. going down around May/June from now on. It's crazy to think about how much time and effort I have put into trying to get them on camera and figure out a patten to see what times they come out at night. Only doing this so I can minimize the time I have to spend out there riding around. Besides the hogs, things have been pretty good this past month. It has been progressively getting cooler however I have stayed strong on the fertility and the PGR's. It's nice to get the occasional compliment about the greens being in great shape. I did have something interesting thing happen however this past month that has been tough to manage. Everybody should know from past "tee to greens" that I don't have many staff members here, myself, an assistant, three full timers and my mechanic. I also have an occasional part timer which is helpful. Well on August 31st, I had a full-time employee retire. He was a great guy and worked with me for over 12 years. Knowing he was retiring I started the search process for my next employee, someone who would potentially fill his shoes. The search went well and I found a good person (so I thought), remember I work for a state agency, so the hiring process is not the easiest (lots of back and forth with HR). Soooo, to make a long story short they worked with me from about September 1st until about September the 8th. LOL. Then decided it wasn't for them. Remember working for the state has its pros and cons. I have been working with only two full-time employees and still in the process of finalizing another hire. We all probably experience this and its just part of managing golf courses. Back to the course, I have tried some different pre-emerge on the greens and had great results so far. I was very happy to have practically no goose grass and crabgrass on the Greens/Collar. I also switched to a slightly different product. So instead of using the combination of oxadiazon/ bensumec, I switched to an oxadiazon active ingredient only. Between the active ingredient, application timing, and the application interval we have seen great results. I don't think the combo product was bad, I just wanted to see if the roots were healthier after a season with oxadiazon only, and of course save a little money for other things as well. The jury is still in deliberations only because I want to see how the poa reacts to this as well. Finally, just like every other course will do, this past month I had the preemerge application sprayed. It's nice not to have that on my shoulders and now behind me. I can't count how many times the weather has been nasty in the past every time I have the company out to spray. I was very thankful that October was filled with beautiful weather just right for spraying. The course has been busy, rounds are definitely up all we can do is hope thing stay great for our awesome industry. It's hard to believe I have almost made it through a whole year as the President of the STGCSA. It seems not long ago when I writing the first message, and now I can't believe this is the last president's message for my term. When I started writing the president's messages I never thought very far ahead about the course and what I do during the course of the year, I mostly thought about the past couple of months between each Tee to Green explaining what I had experienced. Of course, we all have our calendar of what needs to be done and the timing/scheduling of all the normal course maintenance, but I never just sat and thought deeply about how things actually went or how other things can affect us and the course.

I wanted to close like I always have and that's on a positive note. I will always remember the year I was the President of the STGCSA. The year 2020 has definitely been an interesting one to say the least. When I first joined the STGCSA board I did not realize how quickly time would pass on my way to Presidents position. I will always feel that we've had an awesome year even with all the curve balls that were thrown at us. Jim Garrett - Regional Sales Rep @ PBI-Gordon Corporation



I was born and raised in Corpus Christi. My father, a 1942 graduate of Texas A&M, was a manager for a nursery/garden store in Corpus Christi for many years. My mother was a school teacher in the CCISD for over 35 years. I started in the golf industry at Oso Beach Golf Course during the summers when not in school. While attending Texas A&M I worked at the turf research center for Dr. James Beard as the mechanic, repairing and maintaining the equipment as well as maintenance on the research plots. Studying under Dr. Beard and other great professors such as Dr. Murray Milford, Dr. Rick Martyn, Professor J.F. Mills and others was a great experience not just in academia, but for life experience. Their leadership and motivational tactics mentored many students through the rigorous course of classes to obtain degrees from Texas A&M. The Associate Dean of

Agriculture, Dr. R.C. Potts, was also a great mentor to myself and many students, and I credit him for motivating me to complete my course of study and graduate. These were great men.

After graduation I jumped directly into the superintendent role at Victoria County Club and then World Houston Golf Club (now defunct). Leaving the golf industry after these two positions, we started our own landscape maintenance firm in the Corpus Christi area. We grew a reasonably successful business until the oil crunch of the mid 1980's hit and the business had to shut down. These were dark times as a young man with a wife and 2 children to support. Tom Dechant, the Golf Course Superintendent at NorthShore Country Club in Portland, TX, hired me as the head mechanic at the course and shortly thereafter I was promoted to Assistant Golf Course Superintendent. I learned a lot from Tom and 2 years later, I was moving to the Palm Springs, CA area to assume the



GCS position at Rancho Mirage Country Club. At RMCC we were able to update the irrigation system to a VFD pump station and a Toro Network 8000 control system, lowering the irrigation water and electrical expense while increasing the overall effectiveness of the system. After RMCC was sold to a Japanese firm I accepted the golf course superintendents position at Palm Valley Country Club, a 36 hole development club in the Palm Springs area. PVCC was owned by the Sunrise Corporation, which also owned 4 other clubs in the area. While at PVCC I was able to complete the rigorous requirements to become a Certified Golf Course Superintendent (CGCS). After Palm Valley I decided that I needed golf course construction experience and moved to the Dallas, TX area to manage the construction of Tangle Ridge Golf Club for the City of Grand Prairie, TX. When the course opened, it was highly rated in Golf Digest's new courses you can play and is still a tough test of golf skills. After Tangle Ridge, I moved to the construction of Waterview Golf Club in Rowlett, TX. This is where my golf course management career would end. After about 18 years as a golf course superintendent I decided to move to the other side of the desk and into sales.

Len Zimmerer, owner of Zimmerer Kubota, hired me to sell their Bush Hog Turf products to the golf industry in North Texas and Oklahoma. Shortly after joining Zimmerer Kubota I was involved in an auto accident that almost took my life. At 42 years of age a pickup truck hit me as I was walking across a street and put me in the hospital for a week. A major concussion, fractured pelvis and bruised internal organs had me sidelined for a number of weeks. Coming close to death will have a major impact on your outlook of life and lead you to enjoy the small things that come along more like hugs from your kids, cool mornings, the view of the mountains from the valley, dinner with friends and reflecting on the good memories of your life. I have recovered fully and after 3 years with Zimmerer, I took a position with BWI in Dallas, servicing the turf industry with the broad array of products that BWI has to offer. I was an outside sales representative (DSR) with BWI for 9 years before I moved to the Turf Technical Support (TTS) position in the BWI-Dallas office, managing inventory, purchasing turf products and providing technical support to the 25+ BWI DSRs and turf customers across their footprint which is the Southeast quadrant of the United States. After 5 years at the TTS position I assumed my current role as the Regional Sales Representative with PBI-Gordon Corporation. PBI-Gordon is 70+ year old employee owned corporation, providing pest management and fertilizer products to the turf industry through our distributor network.

I currently reside in Cedar Hill, TX with my wife of 41 years (Lynn). We have 2 adult children. Keep your turf disease-free this fall with a program approach

Every season of the year is fraught with its own list of diseases that can impact golf course management. Fall in particular can be problematic, especially where diseases like dollar spot, leaf spot and rusts are concerned.

Dollar spot

Warm days and cool nights that produce heavy dews are conducive for the development of dollar spot. However, taking steps to prevent fall dollar spot can help turf emerge healthier in the spring.

The key to dollar spot control is to plan preventive fungicide applications prior to a disease outbreak. Secure® Action™ and Posterity® fungicides are great options to help control dollar spot this fall. Secure Action provides the protection of a multi-site contact fungicide while Posterity delivers systemic control of dollar spot. The Fungicide Resistance Action Committee (FRAC) considers multisite fungicides to be valuable tools that manage resistance by delaying its development to many pathogens.

Two new fungicides to the Posterity family, Posterity XT and Posterity Forte fungicides, offer even more flexibility with three modes of action for keeping turf disease free this fall. Posterity XT provides control of diseases such as summer patch, anthracnose and take-all patch in addition to dollar spot. Fall clean-up of leaf spot and rusts

- -Occurs in areas that experience more than 10 hours of foliar wetness a day for several consecutive days

- -Favors high amounts of nitrogen and a low mowing height

Rusts:

- -Favor moist, low-light areas
- -Favor temperatures between 65° F and 86° F, depending on the species
- -Severe rust infections occur on slow-growing turfgrass, particularly those with low nitrogen levels and/or plant water stress
- -Secure Action or Posterity XT, applied in early October, can provide excellent control of both leaf spot and rust.

Registration for the 2021 Golf Industry Show will open Oct. 13.



Debunking Common Aquatic Herbicide Misconceptions: Glyphosate

One of the most common questions asked by clients is whether the products that we use to control aquatic weeds and algae in their waterbodies are "safe." These concerns have become considerably more widespread in light of the recent controversies surrounding the herbicide glyphosate. Unfortunately, there is a lot of misinformation that is circulating, making it difficult to discern the difference between public outcry and peer-reviewed scientific data.

Glyphosate is the most widely used herbicide in history. It is a broad-spectrum product that is used worldwide to control weeds in agricultural, turf, ornamental, and aquatic environments. The glyphosate controversy gained momentum in 2015 when the International Agency for Research on Cancer (IARC), an arm of the World Health Organization, classified it as a probable carcinogen after reviewing public studies. And in recent years, a series of multi-million-dollar verdicts have been awarded by California juries to people who have successfully argued that glyphosate caused their cancer. However, after further review uncovered deficiencies in the validity of the findings, two of the studies used as evidence in the trials have now been retracted by the journals in which they were published. After reviewing all of the available studies and information, in 2017 the United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) concluded that "glyphosate is not likely to be carcinogenic to humans...(and there are) no other meaningful risks to human health when the product is used according to the pesticide label." This conclusion is widely shared by other global regulatory and research agencies.

Another misconception about glyphosate is that it kills frogs, which would be extremely concerning for aquatic uses if it were true. However, there is only one study that has been cited by opposition groups to this use pattern, and it was done using a glyphosate formulation that was not approved for aquatic use and should never be used in aquatic environments. The only glyphosate products used in SOLitude's management programs are specially formulated or tank-mixed with an appropriate surfactant that is completely safe for aquatic organisms.




