





Field Notes

December 2017

Hard Winter Precautions

I hope everyone had a great Christmas and a wonderful time with your families.

Since we are already experiencing significant cold temperatures, and it's only December, I wanted to send a reminder to you regarding bermudagrass green care for the hard freeze about to hit as well as potential dangers in January and February. When significant cold is experienced in early winter or in late winter, the tendency for winter kill goes up. Early winter freezes are a problem because the mounds and LDS areas tend to be less hydrated and thus much more susceptible to winter damage. Late hard freezes frequently happen when bermudagrass root and rhizome health is at its worst and thus real damage occurs, again magnified by the lack of hydration.

Therefore, with such early hard freezes occurring, everyone should err on the side of caution when making the decision to cover greens. Moreover, you must make sure the plant and soil are hydrated; a wetting agent is helpful. Moisture contents must be high on the meter readings - remember adequate moisture in the soil buffers temperature fluctuations and reduces the tendency for temperatures to drop as quickly in the profile.

With all this said, I recommend double checking moisture levels now prior to a potential New Year's freeze. Dormant feeding is a great approach as well, for both bentgrass and bermudagrass, and now until January 10-12 is ideal timing. Bermudagrass greens are best fed with a balanced material such as a 13-2-13, 50-70% slow release at about .75 lbs N/1000 sq ft. Continuing with Fe, and other micros as a spray is great, but this dormant feed needs to be granular. Dormant feeding is more productive than late winter feeding because the nutrients can get into the soil solution and be available to the plant as soon as soil temperatures allow uptake.

The same is true with bentgrass greens, but I suggest an analysis such as a 3-1-2 ratio, about 70-80% slow release at .75 lbs N/1000 sq ft. Again, Fe and other micros are productive in the winter to some degree.

Dormant feeding is efficient and productive in a mild winter but especially helpful after a hard winter because it maximizes growth in early spring in a positive way, not a force feed.

Be on your guard this winter. It is one that can sneak up on you before you know it! Ultradwarf recovery in the spring after winter damage is very slow at the worst time of the year for golfer tolerance.
